The Blind Cameleer Tour

Friday 13 August 2021

The bus will leave the Greendale Centre at 9.00 am and head to Gidgegannup Bakery & Café. After morning tea and a comfort stop it will be off to meet Max, the Blind Cameleer at Drome Dairy

The camels at Drome Dairy are rescued from Australia's outback, and are tamed and trained at the camel farm located in the Perth Hills. Max and his team adopt gentle, trust-based training techniques, minimizing the stress on the animals and ensuring herd structures are maintained.

DromeDairy was started by Max in 2015 when he rescued three young camels from the wild, Elke, Petra and Rita. He quickly fell in love with the animals and soon began expanding his camel family.

Max discovered through milking his camels the effect it was having on his skin, and he soon began researching camel's milk and discovered the benefits of this unlikely superfood. This was the beginning of Max's business, Drome Dairy Body + Skin.

We will then travel to Toodyay for lunch and a look around, for anyone game, there will be time for a visit to the Christmas 360 shop.

On the way home we will visit West Swan for some sweet treats and afternoon tea before heading back to the Greendale Centre.
